(noun) to the sport.

kin

(noun) A person's relatives. Jimmy, Joey, Johnny, Jeffy, Jenny, and I are all <u>kin</u>.

luxurious

Providing ease and comfort far beyond what is necessary. Once my album starts selling, I'm going to move out of this little house and into a <u>luxurious</u> mansion in Hollywood.

Other forms: To me it's just normal, but my grandfather thinks that TV is a *luxury* (noun).

luxurious

major
